## **ELP Targets**


#### **NEW for 2023-24**

- The student profile, found in the SDP drill down report, will now include a preliminary visualization of individual ELP targets.
- For each year that a student takes the ACCESS assessment, their score is plotted on the ELP graph. This graph depicts the actual overall composite scale score, the annual scale score target for that year and the projected target for the following year.



**Note**: A projected target is not set for students who have met the exit criteria of an overall composite performance level of 4.8.

Only RICAS item analysis is available in the SDP. To view item analysis for other assessments, such as NGSA or NAEP, you need to go to the individual testing portal (such as the NGSA Portal or the NAEP Questions Tool).



This page of the Rhode Island Public Assessment Data Portal includes the Item Level Analysis tool to assist schools and districts in utilizing the RICAS assessment data. After selecting an assessment, choose options from the various filters to customize the data displayed. All test items are displayed including ES (essay), CR (constructed response), SR (selected response), and SA (short answer). #### Item Level Analysis




The item analysis tool will display each item on the chosen assessment and the **average** percentage, or number of points earned on that item across the state or district.

When looking at the **writing** strand in this visualization, it is important to note that the total number of possible points for **writing** comes from the student's idea development score. The written response item is scored on both idea development and conventions. The points earned in conventions are part of the **language** strand which includes both conventions and selected response items that align to language standards. See visual below:

## Individual Test Updates



#### PSAT 10/SAT: Updates and Reminders

- RIDE will continue to register all students including outplaced, out of state, homebound/hospitalized, and homeschooled (if requested by parent) students for PSAT 10 and SAT.
- Students should be given all accommodations noted in their IEPs or 504s unless the student and/or parent are waiving the accommodation(s).
- SSD online will now automatically upload accommodations to TDTK (which is replacing TIDE).
- ALL accommodations need to be entered on time for them to be approved.
  - Digital test packages need to be provisioned into Bluebook.
    - Requesting accommodations last minute (2-4 days before the window closes) may result in test packages that are not provisioned in time for testing.
- New for 2024- Data Privacy Letters will no longer be shipped to schools and will need to printed and given to students and families.

### PSAT 10/SAT

- Color contrast
- Calculator (Desmos)
- Math Reference Sheet
- Annotator (highlighter and notepad)
- Mark for review
- Answer eliminator (Strikethrough)
- Question navigator (to quickly review and navigate to specific questions)
- Expand passage or item
- Student clock counts down time left for each section and gives a 5-minute warning


### PSAT 10/SAT: Paper Testing

- The only students who will be taking paper tests are those who have paper testing as an accommodation in their IEP.
- This accommodation will need to be entered into SSD online as early as possible to ensure paper tests are available and on time for testing
- Paper test will be the linear test.
- Students will write their answers in their test booklet and then test coordinator will enter all student answers into Bluebook (like the NGSA paper test).
  - Once the test coordinator has recorded all answers in Bluebook, the tests will be returned using the return envelope provided by College Board.





#### What's new?

- Name change: No longer called "Alternate ACCESS for ELLs"
- Redesign:
  - Incorporates the WIDA ELD Standards Framework, 2020 Edition
  - Covers kindergarten, which is part of the new K-2 grade-level cluster
  - Includes brand-new test content and a new test item type
  - Contains an Individual Characteristics Questionnaire (ICQ)
- Alternate PLDs: The new <u>Alternate Proficiency Level Descriptors</u> are an extension of the PLDs found in the WIDA English Language Development (ELD) Standards, 2020 Edition, and describe the continuum of language development.
- Reporting timeline: As with any new assessment, the scores for the WIDA Alternate ACCESS will be delayed due
  to the need to establish cutscores after the first operational administration.

# NGSA Cognitive Labs (Cog Labs)

 RIDE is working with Cambium (our science test vendor) to conduct cog labs for students with disabilities and multi-lingual learners to determine if the accommodations and the test items are accessible to these populations of students.

#### DETAILS:

- Twelve (12) students with disabilities and twelve (12) English language learners. Twenty-four (24) students across the state, not per school.
- Elementary and Middle schools. Only students in tested grades: grade 5 and grade 8.
- When the cog labs would be conducted depends on the school's calendar.
- One interviewer and one observer from Cambium would conduct the cog labs in person.
- Schools would be responsible for ensuring the student is available on the date/time of the cog lab and for providing space for the cog lab to be conducted.
- School staff can be present during the cog lab, depending on student need.

# NGSA Cognitive Labs (Cog Labs)

#### DETAILS, continued:

- Students will respond to one stand-alone question and two clusters. Student work is not scored.
- Cog labs should take about 60-minutes per student.
- Students should have sufficient English language skills to be able to actively participate in the cog lab.
- Students with disabilities must have an IEP and score at the *partially meeting expectations* level or higher on RICAS ELA and be able to actively participate in the cog lab.
- Students will receive a \$25 gift card.

## Best Practices for Selecting Your Testing Windows

- 1. Determine how many staff you will need before selecting your testing window.
- 2. Use as much of the state testing window as possible. Even if your school testing window is over, if you're within the state assessment window, you can continue testing.
- Plan to test 100% of students in each content area.
- 4. Start as early in the state primary testing window as possible.
- 5. Adhere to the state testing window for make-up testing.
