

RI NECAP Science Results for Students in Grades 4, 8, and 11

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Results of the New England Common Assessment Program (NECAP) Science assessment, administered last May to students in grades 4, 8, and 11 showed that statewide, roughly 25 percent of Rhode Island students were proficient in science (up 1.4 percent from the previous administration in May 2008). Additionally, all grades had fewer students that scored significantly below proficient and with the exception of middle school students, more students across the state scored in the proficient category.

In grade 4 approximately 40 percent of students were proficient or above, representing the largest gain (up nearly 4 percent) of the three tested grades. In grade 8, nearly 18 percent of students were at or above proficient, representing a slight dip (down 1.2 percent) from the previous administration. In grade 11, roughly 19 percent of students scored at or above proficiency, which is 3 percentage points higher than the previous year.

The NECAP Science assessment is divided into four sections that assess physical science, earth and space science, life science, and inquiry science. Although there are not enough common items or points within each science domain from year-to-year to construct scale scores, it is still possible to glean useful information for comparative purposes by examining the percentage correct responses based on the total available points in each domain. Doing so yields information that can serve as a rough estimate of where curriculum and instructional practices have succeeded and where further investigation may be required to determine if changes are necessary.

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Overall, while there were some notable increases in the percentage of correct responses in three of the four science domains, and while there were increases in the percentage of students who scored at or above proficient on the NECAP Science assessment in various student subgroups and at some Rhode Island schools and districts, there is still much work to be done across the state in order to increase student achievement in the area of science.

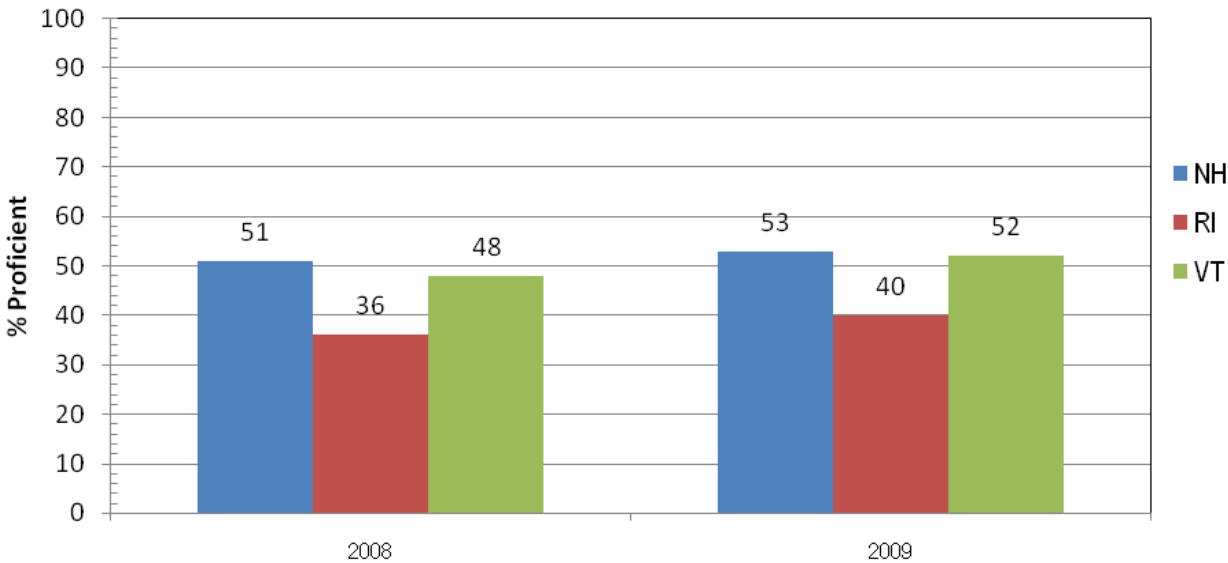

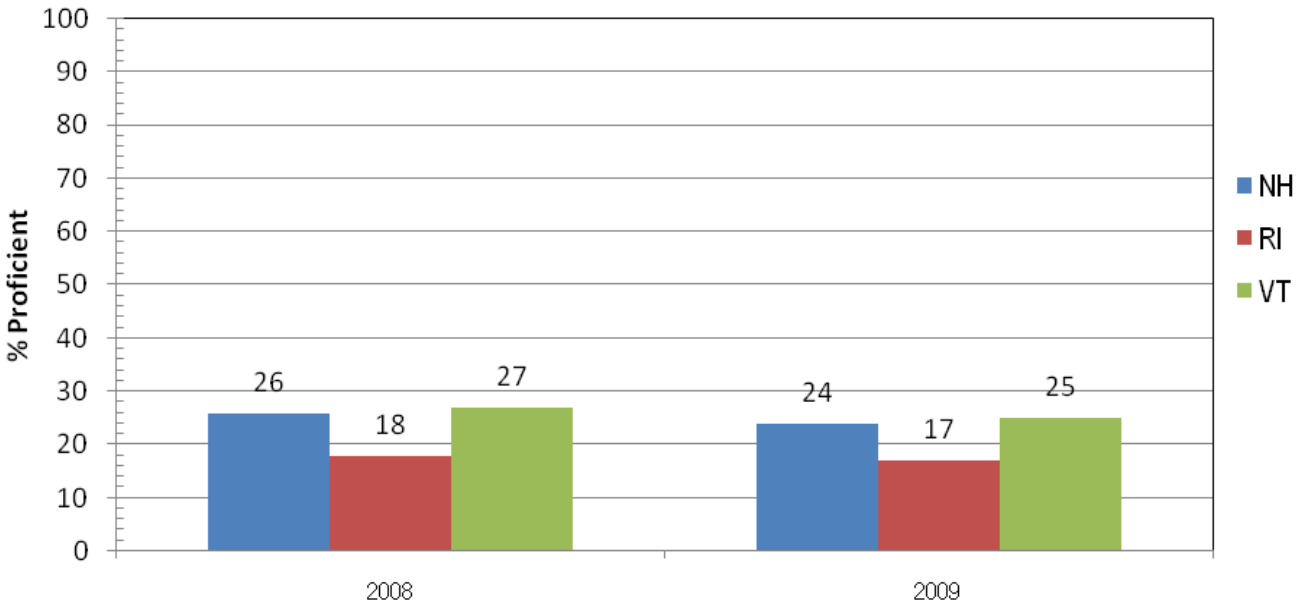

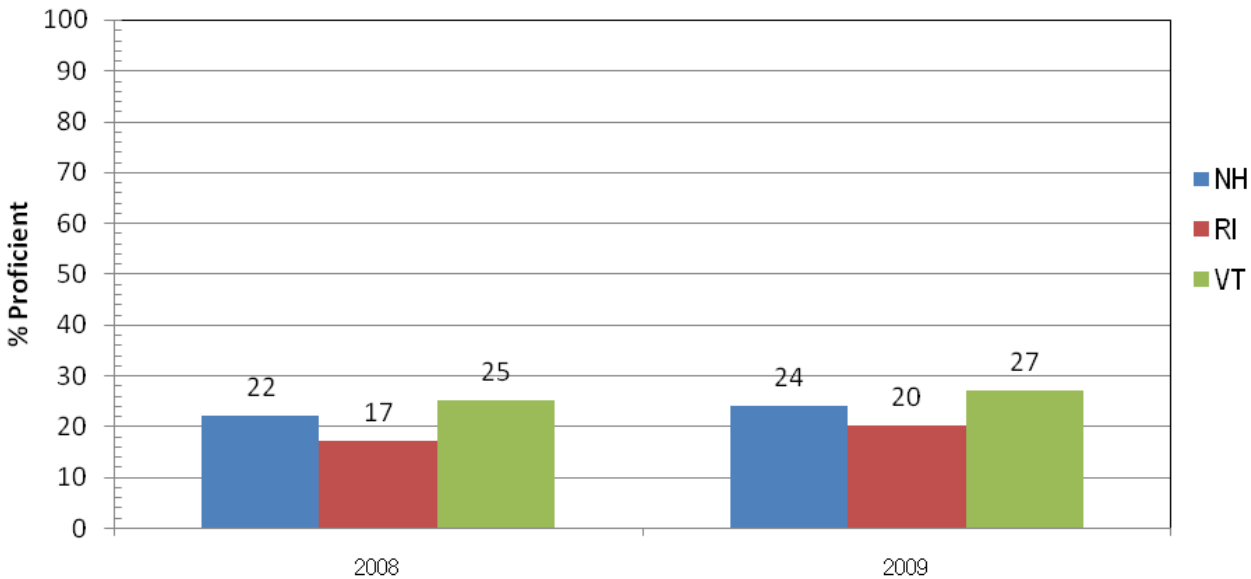

ANALYSIS:

- All three NECAP states experienced an increase in high school science achievement.
- Rhode Island experienced the largest gain in the percentage of students scoring at or above proficient in High School (3% vs. 2% gain for NH and VT)
- Rhode Island high schools continue to lag behind those of the other two NECAP states in science proficiency.

Figure 4. Difference between 2008 and 2009 percent proficient in each district: *Grade 4*

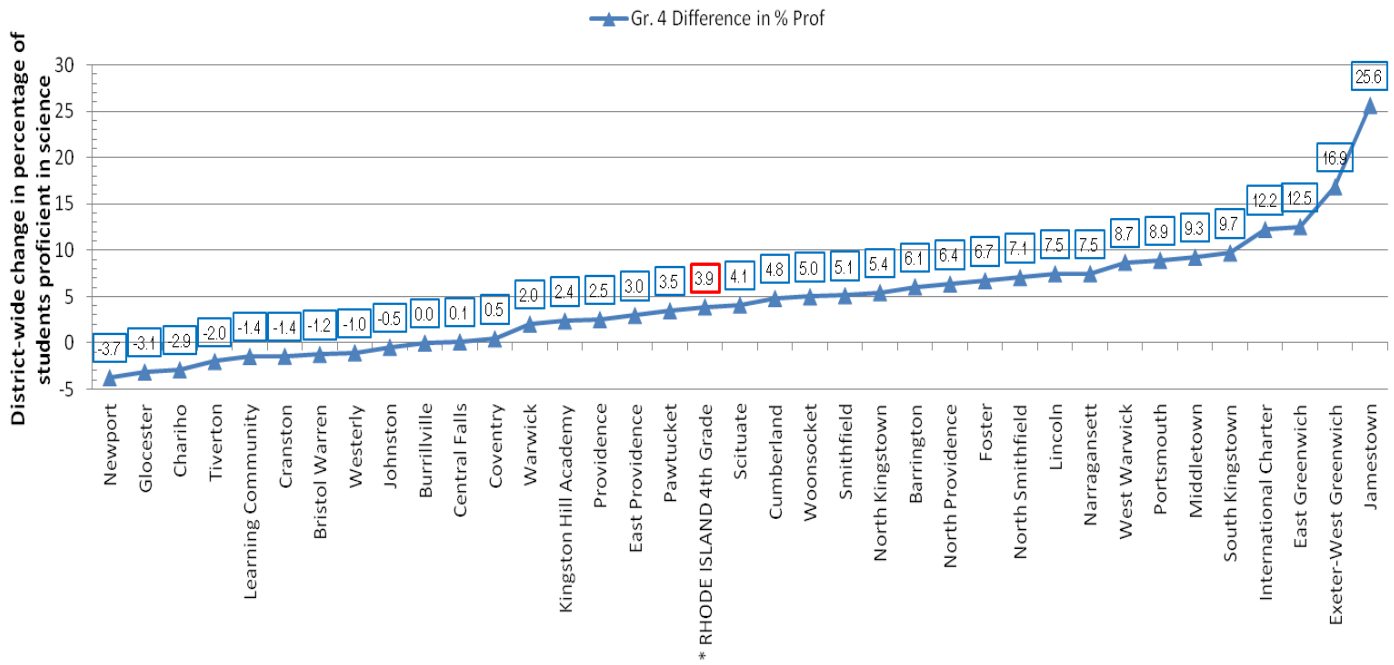

Figure 5. Difference between 2008 and 2009 percent proficient in each district: *Grade 8*

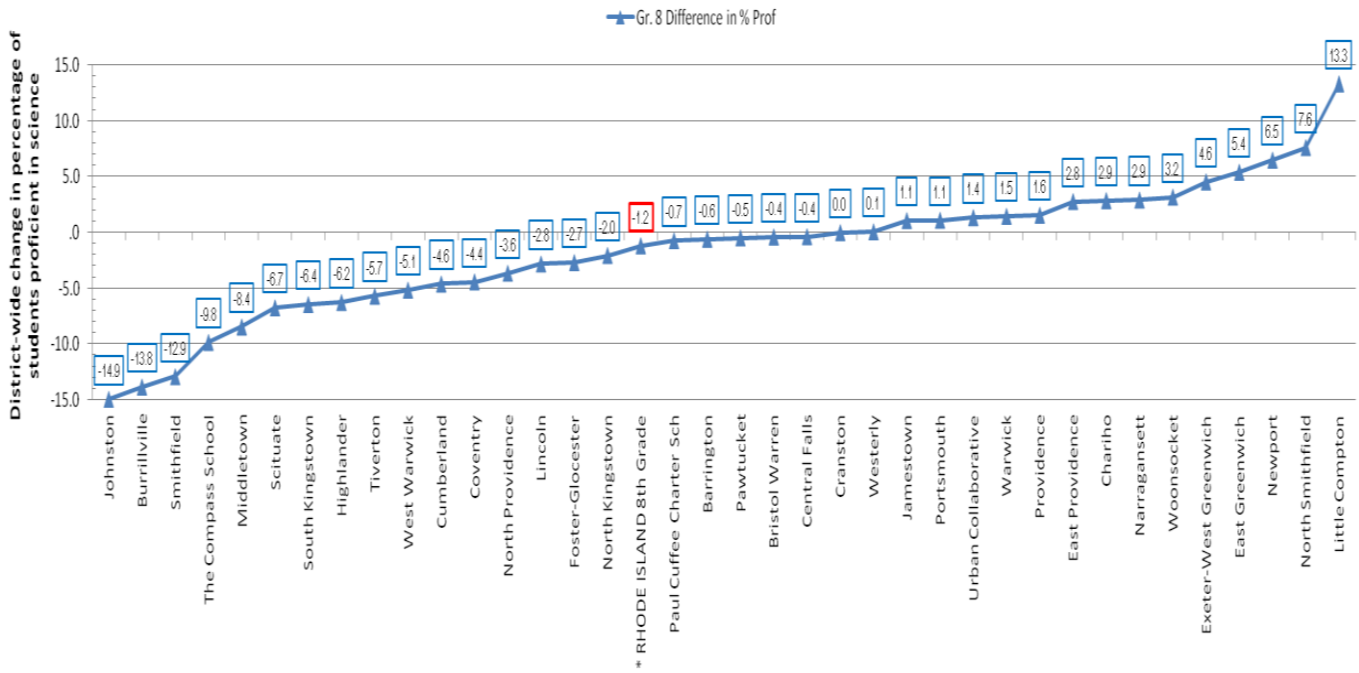

Figure 6. Difference between 2008 and 2009 percent proficient in each district: *Grade 11*

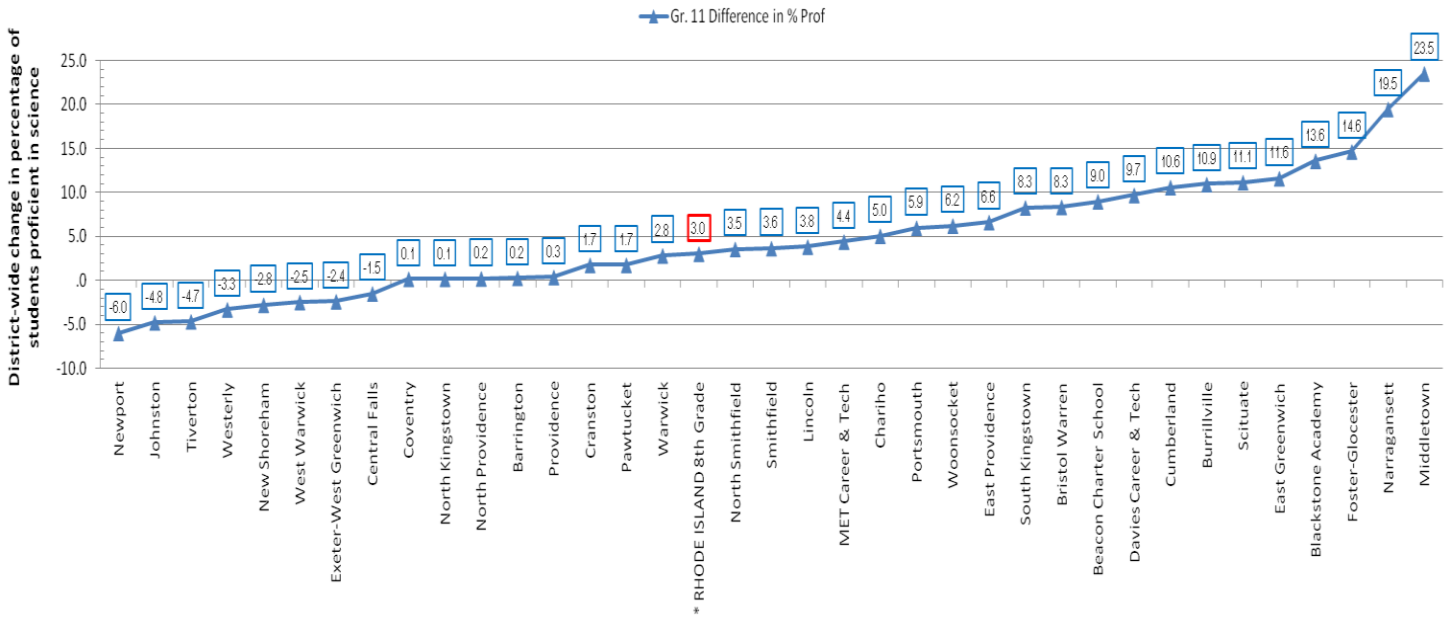

Figure 8. Difference between 2008 and 2009 percent proficient by level of urbanicity: *Grade 4*

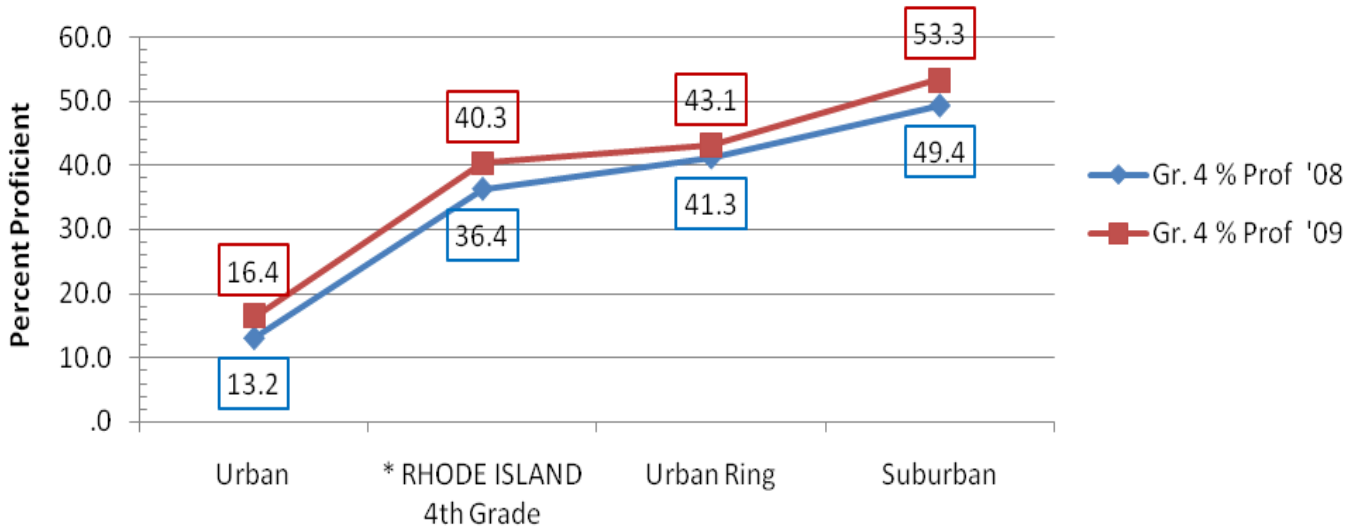


Figure 9. Difference between 2008 and 2009 percent proficient by level of urbanicity: *Grade 8*

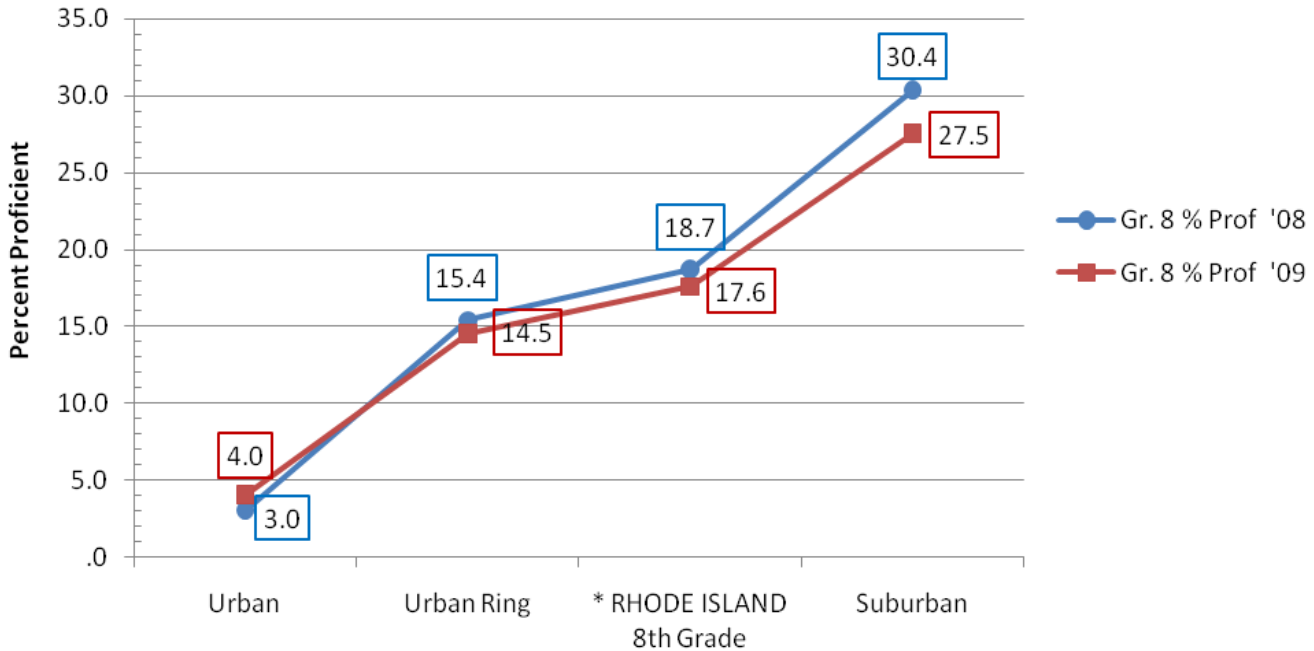


Figure 10. Difference between 2008 and 2009 percent proficient by level of urbanicity: *Grade 11*

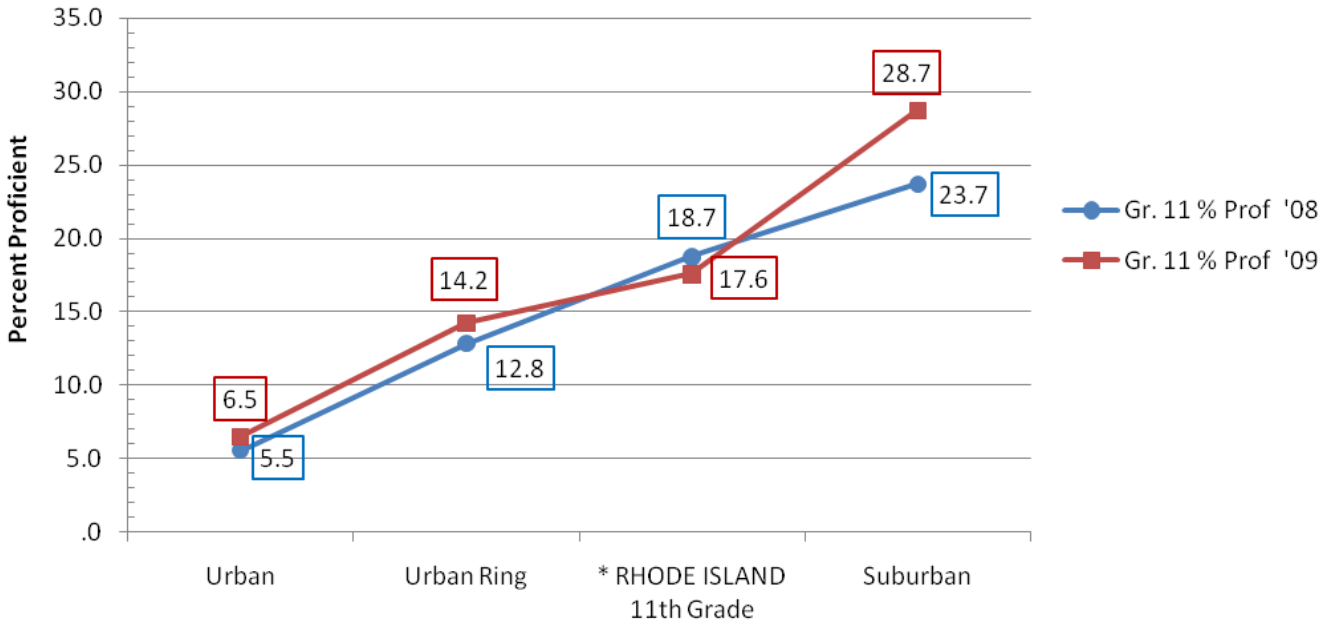


Figure 11. Difference between 2008 and 2009 percent proficient by level of urbanicity: *All Grades*
