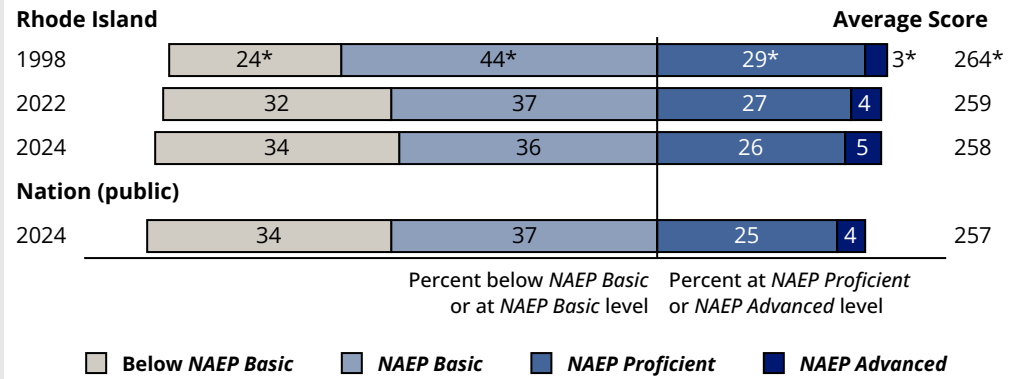


OVERALL RESULTS

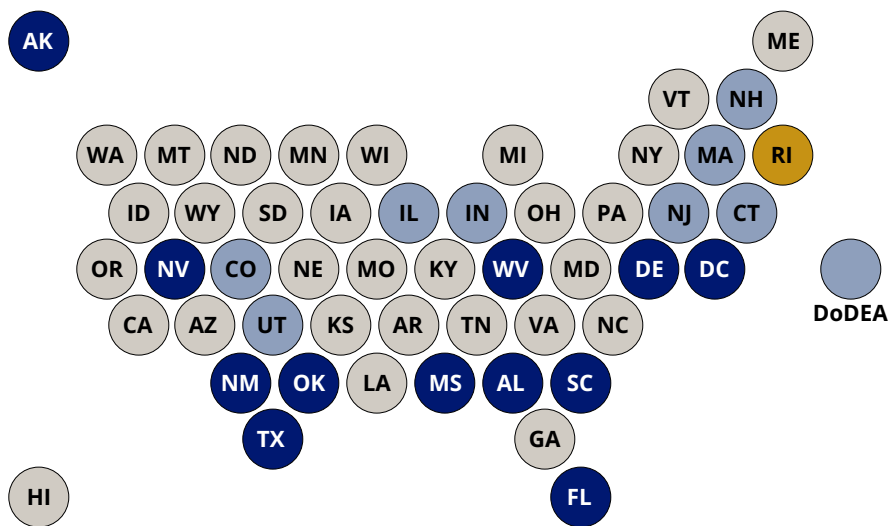
- In 2024, the average score of eighth-grade students in Rhode Island was 258. This was not significantly different from the average score of 257 for students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Rhode Island in 2024 (258) was not significantly different from their average score in 2022 (259) and was lower than their average score in 1998 (264).
- The percentage of students in Rhode Island who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 30 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (31 percent) and in 1998 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in Rhode Island who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 66 percent in 2024. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2022 (68 percent) and was smaller than that in 1998 (76 percent).

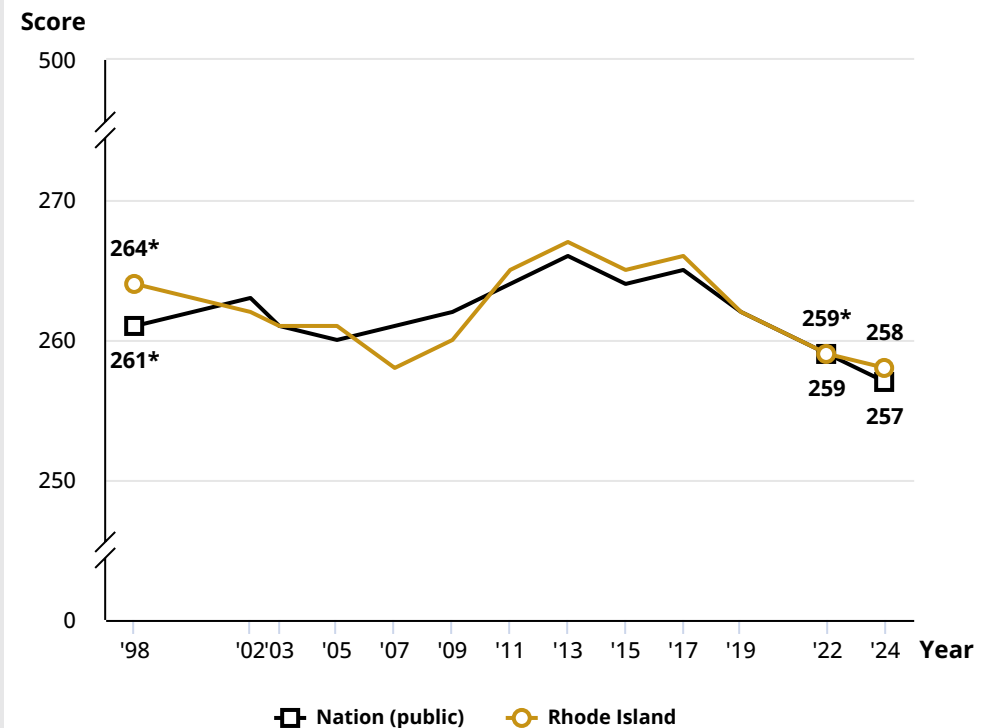
COMPARE THE AVERAGE SCORE IN 2024 TO OTHER STATES/JURISDICTIONS

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2024, Black students had an average score that was 28 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (22 points).
- In 2024, Hispanic students had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (29 points).
- In 2024, male students in Rhode Island had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 7 points.
- In 2024, students who were identified as economically disadvantaged had an average score that was 32 points lower than that for students who were identified as not economically disadvantaged. This performance gap was wider than that in 1998 (26 points).
