

RICAS ASSESSMENTS

The Rhode Island Comprehensive Assessment System (RICAS) is a high quality assessment of English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics given to Rhode Island students in grades 3-8.



Why is RICAS important?

The RICAS assessment gives teachers, students, and families information about student progress, school performance, and how to improve teaching and learning.

Who takes RICAS?

All grade 3 through 8 students who are enrolled in a RI public school.



When will my child take the RICAS?

The **RICAS ELA** assessment window is March 23- April 17, 2026.
The **RICAS mathematics** assessment window is April 27-May 22, 2026.



How do I know how my child performed on the 2025 RICAS assessment?

Each student who takes the RICAS assessment in English language arts and mathematics has a student score report sent to their school to be shared with families. For further information, visit [RIDE's Understanding Scores page](#).

How long are RICAS assessments?

Total testing time varies by subject. Students complete sessions over several days or weeks.

ELA

2 sessions

Suggested testing time per session: 120-150 minutes

Mathematics

2 sessions

Suggested testing time per session: 90 minutes

What types of questions will my child be asked?

Students will answer different types of questions to measure understanding in ELA and mathematics, including multiple choice, fill-in-the-blank, "technology enhanced" questions like drag-and-drop, and written responses.
