Action Plan

If you or someone else in your family is at risk of deportation, you should be prepared for the worst. Here are some things to consider:

- Who will take care of your children? This is especially important for families with US citizen children, as it is possible the parents will be deported but the children will be allowed to remain in the country.
- Who will have your power of attorney? This person will have the power to make legal decisions for you and take care of financial matters.
- What is your medical plan?
- What is your financial plan? Lawyers and legal costs can be expensive, and unfortunately, immigration courts are not required to provide you with representation. Consider crowdfunding avenues such as GoFundMe, and get community support if possible.
- Emergency contacts. Consider downloading the Notifica app, which lets you set custom messages that will be sent to your emergency contacts along with your current location when you encounter police, ICE, or Border Patrol. More information can be found at <u>notifica.us</u> (in English and Spanish)
- **Prepare travel documents.** This is especially important for children. Make sure passports are up-to-date (you can do this by visiting your consulate in the US). However, do **not** carry foreign passports and identification on your person, as if you are detained, this can speed up the deportation process.
- Carry a Know Your Rights card with you. These can remind you of what rights you have during encounters, and in case of a language barrier, you can give one to the officer to invoke your rights and remain silent.
- Know how to locate detainees. If you are detained by ICE, family members can use https://locator.ice.gov/odls/homePage.do to find you. It is easiest if they have your A-number, which will be on all ICE paperwork processing your detainment. Otherwise, they can search using your biographical information.
