Summary of Proposal

- The vision of the Medical Preparatory Academy of Rhode Island (MedPrep) is to "reduce the disparity that exists for marginalized youth in medicine and in postgraduate medical professionals."
- Already has a building identified (The former Bishop Keough Regional High School in Pawtucket)
- MedPrep is endorsed by the Rhode Island Medical Society Foundation (RIMSF) as its establishing agency.
- The school plans to start with 9th grade. They will add a grade per year to build out the high school, and then for years five and six, they will add 7th, then 12th grade.
