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RI Science of Reading Hosts First Conference at The Compass School

KINGSTON, RI -- On September 23, 2023, The Rhode Island Chapter of the Science of Reading (RISOR), in collaboration with educators and practitioners, offered its first professional development conference dedicated to enhancing the literacy instruction skills of teachers. The event took place at The Compass School and featured breakout sessions led by RI educators and distinguished keynote speakers, Dr. Elsa Cardenas-Hagan and Brandee Lapisky.

Dr. Elsa Cardenas-Hagan, a renowned expert in literacy and multilingual learner instruction, discussed strategies for effective literacy instruction among Multilingual Learners (MLLs) that build upon their first language and literacy knowledge for the development of second language literacy.

Brandee Lapisky, Director of The Compass School, shared her school's journey of literacy transformation. She discussed the challenges and successes encountered when harnessing the winds of literacy change, emphasizing the importance of adapting evidence-based literacy practices and supporting educators.

RISOR is a community of educators who live in RI committed to connecting the latest research in reading with classroom teaching practices. The RISOR Conference, sponsored by RIDE, 95 Percent Group, Great Minds and B&M Catering Co., offered an opportunity for administrators and educators to gain valuable knowledge and insights from experts in the field. Attendees left with practical strategies and a deeper understanding of evidence-based practices to support literacy development.
