One of our program initiatives, the Juvenile Justice Program (JJJ), is a comprehensive approach that provides young people, particularly those of color, diversionary options to the formal justice system. Program Description Teach For America Rhode Island supports a new innovative program, Teach For America Ignite. Ignite is a virtual high-dosage tutoring program that matches college students from around the United States with middle and high school students. Our program can work directly with schools and/or learning centers to identify a group of students in need of high-dosage tutoring. Then, we can match students to virtual tutors; typically about 3 students per tutor. Teach For America sources and trains tutors, and works in partnership with on-site program teams to build the tutoring curriculum and ensure that students have the technology needed to engage. Tutoring is run in two 12-week cycles; cycle one is in the fall semester, and cycle two is in the spring. Our model is able to support middle school math and SAT Prep. Program Description The Empowerment Factory (TEF) indoor Art in the Park family art and literacy after school workshops offer exciting and engaging opportunities for families to connect with their schools and other families in their communities. COVID-19 brought many problems for families with young children, including the lack of connection to the schools they attend. This separation has a direct connection to the issue of chronic absenteeism.

One of the largest problems identified for chronic absenteeism is low parent participation and extreme behavioral issues in children caused by social isolation during pandemic school closures. TEF directly addresses these issues in its programming through its social emotional learning (SEL) approach, family art and literacy workshops, and working with schools to help engage parents as much as possible. The first-grade teachers at Fallon Elementary School told TEF that the program at their school produced a dramatic improvement in how the children treated each other. The SEL lessons fostered a positive, more harmonious culture and allowed for more teaching time.

Art in the Park blends SEL, art, literacy, and environmental education to foster mindfulness, creativity, and a love of literacy in elementary-age children while cultivating an open mindset. It engages the whole family in activities. Parents have said that it is a wonderful opportunity to spend quality time with their children and that they have seen a difference in how their children interact with others by showing more kindness and understanding.

Workshops are offered at Title I elementary schools on Wednesday evenings. Each begins with mindful moments to get centered and calm. Then, we read an illustrated children's book, prompting a collaborative discussion about a variety of social and emotional concepts, such as kindness, positive thinking, perseverance, acceptance, empathy, and diversity. The book is followed by an art project that relates to the topic and closes with positive affirmations and self-reflection.
