

School Improvement Plan (SIP) Review & Feedback Tool Overview

The Education Accountability Act (EAA) was passed in 2019 and requires all schools to have a School Improvement Plan (SIP) that is specific to the school's needs and context. Schools must have their SIP entered within the Strategic Planning System (SPS) so that it can be approved by their superintendent no later than July 1 each year. This tool will assist in the review of a school's improvement plan and inform this continual cycle of reflection and growth. This tool will be used to assist in the Superintendent's review of the submitted school improvement plans and to provide feedback to help inform a continual cycle of reflection and growth. The tool may also be used as a self-assessment tool for Principals and School Improvement Teams and by the RIDE Office of School and District Improvement to review and provide feedback to the Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) School Plans. The tool clearly identifies the required components for School Improvement Plans, requirements per RI Regulation and General Law, including the Education Accountability Act (EAA), and requirements per Federal law, including the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) and Titles I, Part A; II, Part A; and IV, Part A (when the plan is being used to fulfill the grant requirements).

The seventeen components of the plans that will be reviewed are listed below:
