

Rhode Island's NECAP Math and Reading Results for Grades 3-8, and 11 and Writing Results for Grade 11¹

October 2009 Testing

STATE-LEVEL RESULTS

Results of the New England Common Assessment Program (NECAP) Reading and Mathematics assessments, administered October 2009 to students in grades 3-8, and 11 showed that statewide, roughly 70 percent of Rhode Island students were proficient in reading (up 2 percentage points from the previous administration in October 2008) and roughly 54 percent were proficient in math (up 1 percentage point from the previous administration in October 2008).

Results of the NECAP Writing assessment, for which only grade 11 results are reported this year,² reveal that roughly 55 percent of eleventh graders were proficient in writing (up 13 percentage points from the previous administration in October 2008).

Due to the small increases in the percent of students who are proficient or above in reading and mathematics, we did not make progress towards achieving our strategic plan objectives for 2012 and 2015 except in high school. Progress at this rate would place us substantially below our 2012 goals.

In general, compared to last year's results, there is a slight increase, though not significant in all grades across all content areas. Exceptions are high school reading where there is a 4 percentage point increase and high school math where results are the same as last year's (see Tables 4-6 below).

ANALYSIS:

Tables 7 and 8 above allow us to follow cohorts of students across grades 3-8. Most notable in these tables is that:

- Students are making progress in reading as they move through higher grade levels. For example, the 60% of the 2005 third-graders were proficient or higher. These same students, now seventh-graders in the fall of 2009 demonstrated that 70% of them were proficient.
- A similar pattern is not seen in mathematics. There is no clear pattern of progress as students move through grades 3 to 8. Grade 11 results remain considerably lower than grades 3-8 results.
- One encouraging pattern is that there is an increase in grade-level achievement (e.g. Grade 8 math proficiency in 2005 was at 48% and increased in 2009 to 54% proficient or above).

QUESTION:

How are students in Rhode Island performing on the NECAP Reading and Mathematics assessments and the Grade 11 Writing⁵ assessment compared to students in Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont?

Rhode Island has made progress closing the achieving gap with Vermont over the years. The gap in grades 3-8 in reading has decreased from 8 percentage points in 2005 to 4 percentage points in 2009. In mathematics, the gap in grades 3-8 has decreased from 13 percentage points in 2005 to 8 percentage points in 2009. Further, at Grade 11, Rhode Island students outscored students in both New Hampshire and Vermont and demonstrated at/above proficiency on the NECAP Writing assessment at rates higher than that of New Hampshire and Vermont (55% vs. 50% and 51% respectively).

The trend is different between Rhode Island and New Hampshire where an achievement gap of 12 percentage points in grades 3-8 in mathematics and 8 percentage points in reading have remained stable.

ANALYSIS:

- Both Rhode Island and New Hampshire students in grades 3-8 increased achievement in reading by two percentage points while Vermont increased by three percentage points.
- Rhode Island continues to lag behind both New Hampshire and Vermont in grades 3-8 reading while Grade 11 students in Rhode Island experienced the greatest gains in the percentage of students at or above proficient and now are tied with New Hampshire students in terms of total percent proficient or above in the state.¹⁰
- Rhode Island continues to lag behind in math in grades 3-8 compared to New Hampshire and Vermont and now Maine.¹¹
- Rhode Island high school students made noteworthy increases in the percent of students at or above proficiency in writing.

The white subgroup continues to maintain a substantial performance gap compared to other ethnic/racial subgroups across all content areas. In reading, the Black subgroup has reduced the gap by three percentage points from 2008 to 2009 while the Hispanic subgroup has reduced the gap by four percentage points during the same period. No such progress is found in mathematics where performance gaps between the white subgroup and the Black and Hispanic subgroups have remained the same.

Figure 1. Subgroups achievement gaps in reading (all grades combined).

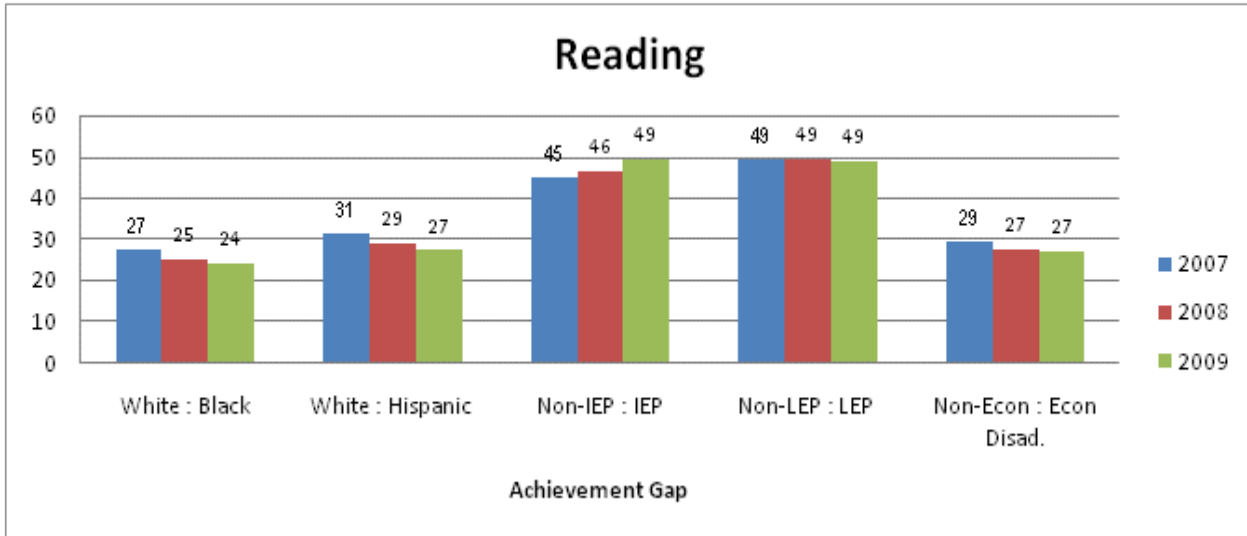
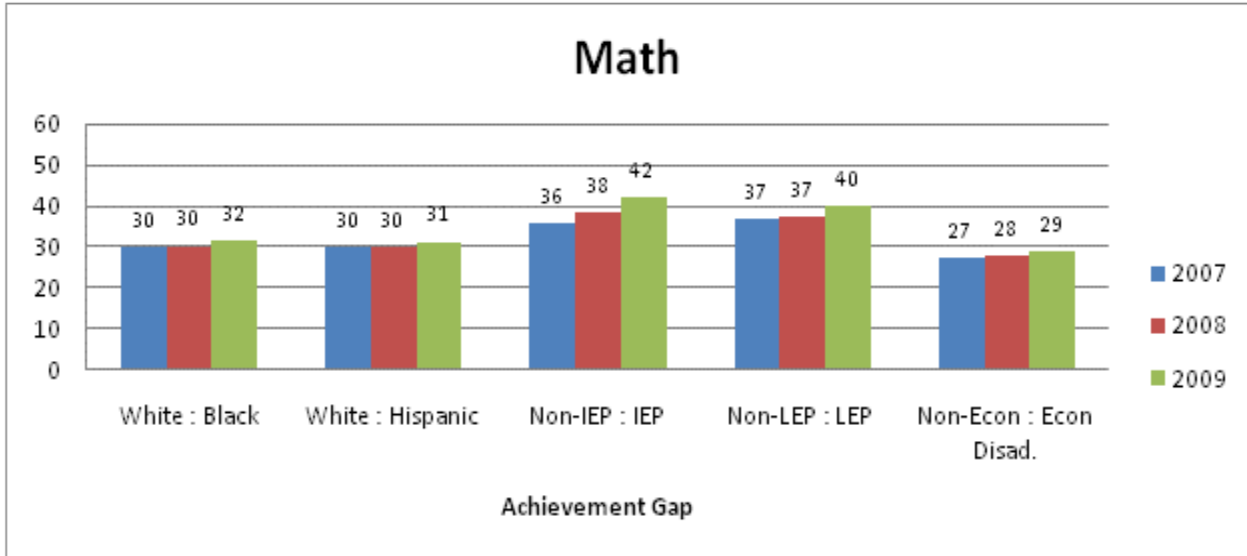


Figure 2. Subgroups achievement gaps in mathematics (all grades combined).



The biggest performance gaps are found in students in IEP and LEP programs compared to students who are not in these programs. In mathematics, the performance gap between students in IEP and LEP and those who are not in these programs has increased by at least 3 percentage points from 2008 to 2009.

- In reading, 17 districts made significant gains while only 1 district decreased in performance. Changes in performance in all other districts were not considered significant.
 - In mathematics, 14 districts made significant gains while only 2 charter school districts decreased in performance. Changes in performance in all other districts were not considered significant.

NOTE: All schools with the asterisk () indicator span more than one level of schooling (e.g. elementary and middle) and thus may show up in other tables (e.g. Tables 14 and 15 above). As such, school-level data posted in tables in this report may not match data sent to schools from Measured Progress. This is not an indication that the posted data are incorrect. Rather, it is a matter of RIDE classifying schools in accordance with school levels reported by the local education agency (LEA).

ANALYSIS:

- In reading, across all three school levels, the percent of schools demonstrating substantial gains between 2008 and 2009 was higher than the percent of schools demonstrating substantial losses. At the high school level in particular, 55% of schools demonstrated significant gains whereas only 10% of schools demonstrated significant losses.
- In math, results were mixed. At the elementary school level, 36% of schools demonstrated significant gains and 29% demonstrated significant losses. At the middle school level, 45% schools demonstrated significant gains and only 7% demonstrated significant losses. At the high school level, however, the same percentage of schools (29%) demonstrated significant gains as did losses.

Glossary of Terms**Minimum Cell Size**

- RIDE Policy on minimum cell size for reporting data stipulates that if $n < 10$ for any subgroup(s) or school- and district-level reporting, then data must be suppressed in public reports.

NECAP Performance Level Descriptors

- ***Proficient with Distinction:*** Students performing at this level demonstrate the prerequisite knowledge and skills needed to participate and excel in instructional activities aligned with the GLEs at the current grade level. Errors made by these students are few and minor and do not reflect gaps in prerequisite knowledge and skills.
- ***Proficient:*** Students performing at this level demonstrate minor gaps in the prerequisite knowledge and skills needed to participate and perform successfully in instructional activities aligned with the GLE at the current grade level. It is likely that any gaps in prerequisite knowledge and skills demonstrated by these students can be addressed during the course of typical classroom instruction.
- ***Partially Proficient:*** Students performing at this level demonstrate gaps in prerequisite knowledge and skills needed to participate and perform successfully in instructional activities aligned with the GLE at the current grade level. Additional instructional support may be necessary for these students to meet grade level expectations.
- ***Substantially Below Proficient:*** Students performing at this level demonstrate extensive and significant gaps in prerequisite knowledge and skills needed to participate and perform successfully in instructional activities aligned with the GLE at the current grade level. Additional instructional support is necessary for these students to meet grade level expectations.
